# **WARNING**

#### TO REDUCE THE RISK OF FIRE, ELECTRIC SHOCK OR INJURY, OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING:-


- 1. Read all the instructions carefully before installation, operation or maintenance of the fan. Failure to comply with instructions could result in personal injury and/or property damage.
- 2. Installation of the fan and the corresponding electrical wiring must be done by a qualified person and be in accordance with all municipal and national electrical Codes and pertinent industry standards should be verified before installation.
- 3. Use the unit only for the intended applications and in the manner indicated by the manufacturer. If you have any questions please contact the manufacturer at the address or telephone number listed in the warranty.
- 4. Moving Parts, Disconnect Power supply before opening. Ensure that all the nuts and screws are securely fastened before restarting the unit.
- 5. Before wiring, servicing or cleaning the unit, switch power off at the service panel and lock it. If service panel is unlocked others could turn the power on unexpectedly and cause fatal electric shock to the installer.
- When cutting or drilling into wall or ceiling, make sure that you do not damage electrical wiring and other hidden utilities.
- 7. Always vent the unit to the outdoors, NOT into unventilated spaces such as garages, attics, crawl spaces, etc.
- 8. The unit must be grounded.
- 9. Do not use any accessories not recommended by the manufacturer.
- 10. Do not use to exhaust hazardous or explosive materials and vapors.
- 11. Do not use this fan with any solid-state speed control device such as dimmer.
- 12. Never place a switch where it can be reached from a bathtub or shower.
- 13. Always use metal duct work to reduce the risk of fire.

To ensure the best air and sound performance it is recommended that the largest diameter ducting is used (5" or 6"). The length of ducting and the number of elbows should be kept to a minimum. As well to protect against condensation problems use insulated ducting. Hard ducting will provide maximum air delivery - if using flexible ducting always ensure it is pulled as tight as possible. Using a short section of flexible ducting in combination with hard ducting will reduce noise transmission.




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#### IN LINE INSTALATION

- 9. LEAKPROOF GRILLE (FOR WALL BOX)


